

LEARN ME SOMETHIN (The Teaching Project)

For this project, you will be “teaching” something to the class. You will have 5-10 minutes TOPS
Keep that in mind as you plan You might choose a word you’d like to teach, a skill you’d like to demonstrate, a fact you’d like to share, a song you’d like to sing, picture you’d like to draw, game you’d like to play, etc. **You will be in GROUPS OF 1-3**

(Some past examples have been: Sharing a song and teaching the chorus, showing how to multiply fractions, demonstrating basics of how to juggle, teaching how to draw Spongebob, creating the “perfect” paper airplane, teaching about a Battle in the Civil War, showing how to properly salute and march, teaching a few phrases of a foreign language, practicing how to shuffle cards, sharing a science experiment, braiding hair, etc.)

REFERENCE: LEARNING STYLES / TOOLS:

- Classical Conditioning** – Learning creates a new response or reaction to something that previously didn’t.
- Operant Conditioning** – Learning uses reinforcement or punishment to encourage or discourage behaviors.
- Observational / Modeling** – Learning comes from watching and mirroring.
- Visual** – Images, Video, Graphics, Pictures, Drawing, etc.
- Auditory** – Sounds, Music, Spoken Words / repetition from teacher, songs, etc.
- Verbal** – reading out loud, speaking, word games, writing, group repeating, etc.
- Kinaesthetic** – movement, “hands on”, exercise, sports, acting out, etc.
- Logical** – self-solving, individual response, asking questions, experimenting, puzzles, mysteries, etc.
- Social** – working with others, groups, sharing, conferencing, socializing, etc.
- Solitary** – solo thinking time, few instructions, independence, research, journal prompts, etc.
